Creighton Romeo Gibson was born in New Orleans, Louisiana on November 30, 1955. He was the 2nd son of Margaret Naomi Deville Gibson and Peter Roeling Gibson Sr. He was called home on June 24, 2021, shortly after the death of his beloved daughter Channel Juliette Spencer. So much is to be said about Creighton- how he loved to laugh and tell bad jokes, how he was the center of his family's universe – keeping all who were blessed to call him father/uncle, cousin, brother or friend close to his heart and his attention. The most significant aspect of his legacy was his love of the Lord Jesus Christ, his faith in God, and the peace that comes with following God's Divine Instruction. Creighton graduated from Alcee Fortier High then went on to Grambling State University where he proudly played baritone as a "Mighty Marching Tiger". After leaving the university, he began working as a chef at Frank's Steakhouse in New Orleans and a local restaurant in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. Later in life his humanitarian nature led him to become a 1st responder. He began employment with Acadian Ambulance Services, where he would land the plum assignment of standing by at the New Orleans Saints games. Folks would instantly fall in love with him because of his warm personality. Creighton was also a minister and a prayer warrior. When his brother Chad fell ill, he started a prayer line for his family that remains in service today. His dear nephew DeJongh Wells has picked up the warrior's torch.

Creighton was preceded in death, by both his parents; brothers Cortland Caliup, Peter R. Gibson Jr., Chadwick Gibson; sister Carmelita Watkins; son

DeAndre Saulsberry; daughters Brittany Gibson and Channel Juliette Spencer; and Uncle Warren Gibson. He is survived by his wife, Sonia Thompson-Gibson, son, Alden Dawson, daughter, Mar-Keisha Saulsberry, sister, Claire O. Wood, uncle, Sidney Charles Gibson, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. His legacy will continue to live on through the people who he loved and whom he loved him in return.
