Gloria passed away peacefully at her home on November 29, 2017, after a long triumphant battle with breast cancer; she was surrounded by her family and caregivers. In January, she would have celebrated her 69th birthday.

She attended high school at Saint Bernard Consolidated High School, earned a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Dillard University and a Master's degree from Loyola University, in New Orleans, Louisiana. Gloria was an educator for over thirty years, lending her God-given talent as a music teacher, specializing in piano instruction in Saint Bernard Parish, Werlein's Music Store in New Orleans on Canal Street and ended her teaching career as a counselor in Saint Charles Parish. After retiring from the

Louisiana Public school system, she embraced her entrepreneurship talents to assist her husband, Curtis, in opening a soul food restaurant, The Praline Connection. She worked as the Office Manager at the restaurant for almost 25 years. She wore many hats at the restaurant and was instrumental in making the business successful.

Throughout her life, she was a devoted and dedicated Christian who attended church at Mount Olive in Saint Bernard Parish, First Free Mission Baptist Church in New Orleans, and White Dove Fellowship in Harvey. During her illness, she was strengthened by God's words and leaned on her faith in Him.
