We did just what he said, that fatherly voice we needed away from home gave us what we needed. We sat together in Judson Cross and waited to get word from home. But that first chance we could hit the highway, we did!

He has influenced my life in so many ways and I fell more in love with poetry, African American poets, writers and African Art and not to mention my public speaking and reading to this day to various types of audiences. When people extend a compliment to me and say that I spoke well and eloquently, I think of Dr. Jerry Ward and am honored to have been a student and product of his instruction. Rest Well Dr. Ward!
