My father's name is Johnny Scott, Sr. Born in Natchez, Mississippi. My mother's name is Hazel Scott Kemp, born in Baton Rouge, La. My union with Gladys Johnson on March 16, 1943, gave me six beautiful children Johnny Scott III (Janet), Michelle S. Brown (Kenneth), Jennifer M. Schexnayder Lee(Edward), Eric T. Scott (Claudia), Musette R. Jones, and Tomica S. Smith (Tiger), 12 grandchildren, 40 great grandchildren, and 8 great great grandchildren. He leaves three sister's Mattie Hillard, Eula Vinnett, Beverly Carraby and a host of in-laws, nieces, nephews, cousins, family and friends. He was preceded in death by his father, Johnny Scott Sr, mother, Hazel Scott Kemp, and sister Sally Jarriet.

I was born June 20, 1925 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Moved to New Orleans when I was two years old. I attended school at McDonough #36, Thomy Lafon School, and J. W. Hoffman Straight Business School, and also school for cooking and baking. My occupation was a psychotherapist, which began October 27, 1948 at the Veterans Administration Hospital in New Orleans, Louisiana, where I worked for twenty three years. I served my country in the Army from November 4, 1943 through February 26, 1946. Served in the South Pacific Theatre, saw battle in Borabora, Fincheaven New Guinea, Hollander, New Guinea, Tacobln Leyte in Philippine Islands, Gaudicial Canal and

participated in two invasions; discharged from Tokyo, Japan. Rated as Staff Sergeant, remained on inactive, reserved duty for seven years. Medals consists of Good Conduct, Asiatic Pacific, Three Bronze Stars, Sharp Shooter four times, World War II, and Japan Occupation. Served as a truck driver and dispatcher and supply sergeant. I was a faithful member of the Historic Second Baptist Church for over sixty years. Where I served as Deacon, Treasurer, Secretary, Radio Broadcast Technician, Choir member, and maintenance man. He is also survived by a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.
