Louis Anthony Green, born June 17, 1955, passed away peacefully on April 22, 2025, at 69 in Slidell, Louisiana.

Born and raised in New Orleans, Louis proudly enlisted in the U.S. Navy in October 1974, where he served aboard the USS Kawishiwi (AO 146) and was awarded the National Defense Service Medal. After his honorable military service, he returned home during a transformative time for the city, just after the opening of the historic Rivergate Convention Center and the groundbreaking Hotel Marriott, New Orleans' first hotel with 1,000 guest rooms.

Beginning in the late 1970s, Louis built a long and distinguished career in the city's tradeshow and special events industry. From drafting and decorations to planning, on-site supervision, marketing, and senior account management, Louis was a trusted and respected leader. He played an instrumental role in countless events, including the Zulu Ball and St. Mary's Academy Annual Debutant Balls, public dedications, inaugurations, and Carnival celebrations. His integrity, work ethic, and warmth earned him the admiration of colleagues and clients alike.

Outside of his professional life, Louis embodied the spirit of New Orleans. He knew every good restaurant in town and loved sharing his favorites. A gifted bass guitarist, he brought joy to many through soulful jam sessions with family, friends, and fellow musicians. He cherished storytelling, quality time with loved ones, and the simple pleasures of life—whether driving through the city,

enjoying a good cigar, or sipping coffee on the porch as he greeted neighbors with a warm smile and his signature, “Hello, dawlin’,” in his unmistakable New Orleanian drawl.

After the tragic loss of his mother at the age of 11, Louis stepped into the role of caregiver for his siblings, becoming a lifelong provider, protector, and patriarch—a steady presence who anchored his family with love and strength. He leaves behind a legacy of devotion and dignity. Louis is survived by his children, Raven Landry and Anthony Green, and stepchildren, Angeline Hampton, Melody Morgan, and Tremain Campbell. He was preceded in death by his beloved mother, Audrey Mae Francis, father, Louis Alex Green, spouse, Tanya Campbell-Green, brothers, David Green and Anthony Joseph Green, and nephews, Darius Green and Atlas Ogletree.

Louis will be deeply missed and lovingly remembered by all who had the honor of knowing him.

A viewing will be held at 9:30 a.m., followed by a funeral service at 10:30 a.m. on Friday, May 16, 2025, at Starlight Missionary Baptist Church, 2100 Second St., Slidell, LA 70458. Interment will follow at 12:30 p.m. at Southeast Louisiana Veterans Cemetery, 34888 Grantham College Dr., Slidell, LA 70125. The repast will be held at 1:00 p.m. at Blanc & Brick, 2144 First St., Slidell, LA 70458.
