Dr. Scott S. Steckler

On Friday, December 11, 2015 Dr. Scott Stephen Steckler passed away surrounded by family. He was the beloved son of the late Arthur Steckler, Jr. and Emelda Davis Steckler. He had two siblings, the late Arthur Steckler III, and Dr. Starr Steckler of Slidell. He is survived by his daughter Shay Angeline Steckler and son Cory Patrick Steckler.

A dedicated educator for 46 years, Dr. Steckler began teaching in 1969 at Airline Park Elementary. He also taught special education at Dolhonde Elementary and McDonogh #27 Special School. He became parish-wide Supervisor of Special Education, then principal of Henry Ford Junior High for 8 years, and has been principal at George Cox Elementary for the past 28 years.

Dr. Scott Steckler was an active member of the American Association of Kidney Patients, lobbying congress for improvements in kidney dialysis. He routinely sought opportunities to improve the communities of which he was a part through both large contributions and small personal touches.

Visitation for Dr. Steckler will be held on Saturday, December 19th, beginning at 8:30 a.m., at St. Mary of the Angels Catholic Church, 3501 N. Miro St., 9th Ward of New Orleans. This is where Scott was baptized, attended grammar school, and later attended mass and participated in community activities. Vigil Mass will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. This will be followed by burial at Greenwood Cemetery, 5200 Canal Blvd. An additional reception, beginning at

1:30 p.m., will take place at George Cox Elementary School at 2630 Belle Chasse Hwy in Gretna. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to Buhangijia Nursery School in Shinyanga, Tanzania.
